The first seminar was entitled "How did Arab Christian theologians explain the doctrine of the Trinity?" Rev. Dr. Wajih Yousef Mikhael presented this lecture.

Dr. Wajih Mikhael is a researcher in the Arab Christian heritage and holds a Ph.D. in Philosophy from the University of Birmingham, United Kingdom, in 2012.

The second seminar was entitled "Union with Christ and Our Sanctification." The Seminar covered the doctrine of union with Christ through the word of God, how the Church understood it, and its role in growing in a life of holiness.

The speaker for the seminar was "Dr. Mike Reeves," Dean of Union College, UK. Dr. Reeves is a priest in the Anglican Church and was previously an Associate Pastor at All Souls Church, Langham Place, London. He is also a Professor of Systematic Theology at the same college.
